The A Puritan Catechism, along with the A Puritan Confession were both compiled by Charles Spurgeon. Most notably, this catechism was published in 1855 when Spurgeon was only 21 years of age. On October 14 of that year, Spurgeon preached Sermon No. 46 to several thousand who gathered to hear him at New Park Street Chapel.

Creeds, Confessions and Catechisms. The word "creed" comes from the Latin credo meaning "I believe". The bible authors do not lay out the various doctrines in a systematic formula, thus the reader is left (with the illumination of the Holy Spirit of course) to piece together the various doctrines from a wide variety of literary type writings such as historical narratives, poetic illustrations, parables, letters and other genres.

If creeds are the Church's bones and confessions are denominational muscle, catechisms are the feet. They represent "the practical, 'on-the-ground' application of the main teaching agreed upon at church councils and expressed through creeds and confessions."

The Scottish Commissioners who were present at the Assembly were satisfied with the Confession of Faith, and in 1646, the document was sent to the English parliament to be ratified, and submitted to the General Assembly of the Scottish Kirk.
